CASTLEDARE VILLAGE Gardening Workshop


We had so many people come and attend our first gardening workshops of the year.

LESLEY'S RECIPIE



Christmas Salad with Strawberry Dressing

Ingredients:

Salad Dressing:

- 2 spoons balsamic vinegar
- 2 spoons olive oil
- Punnet of strawberries
- Pepper to taste

Salad:

- Green or red capsicum
- Cos lettuce
- Cherry tomatoes
- Lebanese cucumber
- Spring onions
- Strawberries

Put in anything you like to make the salad look Christmas-y. You don't need to include anything you or your family don't like. Kids love this salad too.

<u>Steps:</u>

Salad Dressing:

1. Combine all ingredients and blend together with a stick blender

Salad:

- 1. Cut green or red capsicum into thin strips.
- 2. Cut cos lettuce into small bite sized pieces.
- 3. Cut cherry tomatoes into halves.
- 4. Slice Lebanese cucumbers at an angle
- 5. Slice spring onions length-ways in finger-length sections & place into ice-cold water for a while. This makes them curl up.
- 6. Cut strawberries into halves.
- 7. Combine all ingredients into a salad bowl and drizzle salad dressing on top.
